Rocking Paper Plate Santa

# What you need:

- •a paper plate (one paper plate will make two snowmen)
- •scissors
- •glue
- black marker
- orange paper for the nose
- •black paper for the hat
- colored paper for the scarf

Any other decorating materials are naturally more than welcome, some silver or blue glitter glue might give nice little snow sparkle effect.

#### Instructions

- 1. Fold the paper plate in half. Cut along the fold to get two two equal pieces.
- 2. Take one half of the paper plate, roll it into a cone.
- 3. Apply glue on one end, and glue together into a cone shape. Hold together until the glue sets. You can use a clothespin for this task, and continue crafting.
- 4. Draw eyes and buttons with a black marker. Cut out a carrot nose shape out of orange paper. Apply a smaller amount of glue and stick the nose under the eyes. Draw mouth with a black marker. Cut scarf out of scarp paper. Glue it on the paper plate snowman. Cut a hat shape out of black paper. Glue the hat on top of your rocking paper plate snowman.
