ROOF REPAIRS (KNOX)

At an emergent meeting of the Presbytery of Waterloo Wellington held May 30, Knox was granted a loan of up to \$250,000 to cover the cost of the new roof. This will allow the congregation to go ahead with the installation of a new roof the end of August beginning of September with Classic Roofing. At this time, we will not be moving ahead with the sale of the manse.

On June 12, each congregation voted to move forward with amalgamation and the sale of the Bethany and Alma United buildings. Each congregation will have their final worship services on October 9 or 16. The amalgamation would take effect on November 1, with its first worship service of the new congregation on November 6.
