Next steps

The Presbytery of Waterloo Wellington has already granted me permission to retire. They will in the coming months appoint an Interim Moderator who will oversee the Call process. The Sessions of Knox and St. Andrew's have offered their suggestions of who they would like to work with. This person will take care of filling the pulpit, insure the sacraments are maintained, oversee pastoral care, weddings and funerals and conduct Session meetings. They may not personally carry out these duties but they will make sure that someone does.

In the coming months, St. Andrew's and Knox will form a search committee and prepare congregational profiles. We will be looking for volunteers from both congregations. The size and composition of the committee to be determined by the Interim Moderator and the Sessions of Knox and St. Andrew's.

Although an actual vote on a new minister is many months away, there are a couple things that need to happen before that. Firstly the Sessions of St. Andrew's and Knox will be taking a look at their lists of members to make sure they are accurate. This may involve contacting people that we haven't seen for awhile to make sure they are interested in participating in the call process. Secondly, and this is where you come in. If you are not a member of St. Andrew's or Knox, this is an excellent time to join. Whether you like to transfer your membership or you would like to attend communicants classes, this is your opportunity to shape the future of both congregations by helping to chose who will lead you into the future. Clean Out-the Refrigerator Crustless Quiche

4 eggs

1/4 cup melted butter or margarine

1/2 cup all purpose flour

1/4 tsp salt

1/2 tsp baking powder.

13/4 cups milk

1 1/2 cups diced cooked ham, cooked sausage, green pepper, green onion, sliced mushrooms, cooked broccoli, etc., etc.

2 cups shredded cheese...Swiss, Monterey Jack, cheddar, colby...again, whatever is on hand.

Preheat oven to 350 F. Grease a 9" pie plate. In a large mixing bowl. whisk the eggs and melted butter together. Set aside: Stir or sift the flour with the salt and baking powder. Add it to the egg mixture. Fold in the meats and vegetables that you are using and pour into the prepared pan. Top with the cheese. Bake for 50-60 minutes or until golden and puffed. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving.

Some Notes From the Past

EloraObserver August 29, 1878

Lizzie Gabe, ten year old, fell asleep during the service in Knox Church on Sunday evening. By general oversight she was allowed to remain sleeping after the service ended, the congregation dismissed and the doors securely locked. She was not released until the bell ringer went to ring the bell the next morning.

Mr. Gay, when organist in Knox Church, used to leave the organ bench at the beginning of the sermon and sit in the nearest front pew. One Sunday, the sermon ended, the last hymn given out and sung with him still asleep, the benediction given and the congregation left. The janitor wakened him that he might lock the church.
